TJCSGA Golf Tournament

FOUR MAN SCRAMBLE RULES OF PLAY



- 1) Men play from the men's tees. Women play from the women's tees.
- 2) On every hole, each team member may hit a tee shot.
- 3) The team then selects one of the tee shots from which to play.
- 4) All team members may then hit from that position.

- A. Each team member may place his/her ball within one club-length of the selected shot, no nearer to the hole. If the selected shot is played from a **hazard** the ball may be placed within one club-length, but must remain in the hazard and placed no nearer to the hole. The rough is not considered a hazard, so if the "club length" reaches the fairway, then that is legal. If the selected shot is on the fringe of the green, the ball may be placed within one club-length, but cannot be placed onto the putting surface.
- B. Each team member may improve his lie by placing the ball with his hand or by moving it with the club head. The ball is in play once the player has addressed it, or has made a stroke at it.
- C. When putting, the ball must be placed within on putter head length of the selected shot, no nearer to the hole. Teams are cautioned not to make tap-ins until all team members have had the opportunity to make the team's original putt. Once a ball is holed out, no further strokes are permitted.
- D. Team members may stand behind one another (on an extension of the line of play) while they are hitting a shot or putt.

- 5) This procedure is repeated until the ball is holed.
